

Brief History

Water quality at Parlee Beach has been an area of concern for residents of the Shediac Bay Watershed and for those who enjoy visiting this popular recreational attraction for many years. In 2016, the Government of New Brunswick formed a Steering Committee tasked with gathering information to help gain a better understanding of the source of the water quality concerns.

The results of numerous studies and projects undertaken between 2017 and 2018 were summarized by the Steering Committee in the Parlee Beach Water Quality Shediac, New Brunswick Final Report. The report concluded that while water quality at Parlee Beach is very good most of the time, there are water quality issues within the Shediac Bay Watershed that should be addressed. The development of a Shediac Bay Watershed Management Plan was identified as an important step in addressing water quality issues in the watershed. Improving water quality in the watershed will in turn help protect and improve water quality at Parlee Beach.

In 2019, a working group was formed by the New Brunswick Department of Environment and Local Government (NBDELG) to develop a watershed management plan for the Shediac Bay watershed. The Working Group met regularly and in total, three rounds of engagement took place in October 2019, August 2020 and February 2021. The plan was published in both official languages on October 22, 2021.

Structure

With the help of the NBDELG, an implementation committee was created, consisting of representatives from various governmental agencies (municipal, provincial and federal), First Nations groups, businesses, organizations and the general public. This committee was created to keep stakeholders updated on progress towards the goals and action items in the plan, and to help create partnerships to complete these goals.

To further focus on single goals and action items, subcommittees were created for five of the seven goals. These subcommittees have more focused, in depth discussions on specific action items under their respective goal. Subcommittees can invite guests to their meetings that bring relevant knowledge and expertise to the table.

The implementation committee and subcommittees meet regularly to work on progressing the goals and action items outlined in the plan, through an Annual Watershed Management Plan Implementation Cycle.

Meeting History to Date

Since the creation of the Implementation Committee, six meetings have been held. These meetings took place on January 31, 2022, March 23, 2022, April 21, 2022, October 13, 2022, December 5, 2022, and February 23, 2023.

Four subcommittee meetings were held in addition to the full implementation committee meetings:

- Subcommittee #2 Protect and Improve Water and Habitat Quality met on October 4, 2022;
- Subcommittee #3 Improve Stormwater Management met on February 7, 2023;
- Subcommittee #4 Improve Wastewater Management met on November 16, 2022; and
- Subcommittee #5 Protect the Coastal Areas of the Watershed met on November 16, 2022.

Figure 1: Shediac Bay Watershed Boundaries




Figure 2: Annual Watershed Management Plan Management Cycle
